





# CYGNET COLOUR RUSH DK BLOCK STITCH SHAWL CY1684

## Materials -

2 x 100g balls of Cygnet Colour Rush DK in Sunburst 654

Small about of Pato in White 999 for trim and tassel

4 mm crochet hook

Piece of cardboard to make tassels

#### Pattern notes -

UK terminology used

This pattern is an easy 2 row repeat

The size of the shawl can be made longer or shorter by making more or less rows.

# Abbreviations explained -

The chain 1 does not count as a stitch

The chain 4 counts as a treble crochet and chain 1

Cluster – work 3 treble crochet into the same stitch or space.

**Abbreviations -** sk - skip t - turn your work

 $tr - treble \ crochet$  st(s) - stitch(s) fo - fasten off yarn sp(s) - space(s)

dc – double crochet tur – turning nxt – next

ch(s) - chain(s) cl(s) - cluster(s) bet - between

Make a magic ring, or alternatively ch 4 and slst to join into a ring

Row 1 – into ring work ch 4 + cl + ch 4, tighten ring

Row 2 – ch 1, t, into ch 1 sp work dc + ch 3 + dc (1st loop made), ch 3, sk cl, into last ch 1 sp, dc + ch 3 + dc

Row 3 – ch 4, t, [cl into nxt ch 3 sp] twice, into last ch 3 sp work cl + ch 1 + tr

Row 4 - ch 1, t, into ch 1 sp work dc + ch 3 + dc, [ ch 3, sk cl, dc into sp bet cls ] twice, ch 3, sk cl into last ch 1 sp work dc + ch 3 + dc

Row 5 - ch 4, t, [cl into nxt ch 3 sp] 4 times, into last ch 3 sp work cl + ch 1 + tr

Row 6 - ch 1, t, into ch 1 sp work dc + ch 3 + dc, [ ch 3, sk cl, dc into sp bet cls ] 4 times, ch 3, sk cl into last ch 1 sp work dc + ch 3 + dc

Row 7 – ch 4, t, [cl into nxt ch 3 sp] 6 times, into last ch 3 sp work cl + ch 1 + tr

Continue increasing in this fashion until you reach you desired length, ending with a block row

### Trim -


Row 1 - with wrong side facing and working down the edge, towards the point, attach white yarn into ch 1 sp, ch 1, \* dc into ch 1 sp, ch 3, sk cl, dc into dc on loop row \*, rept from \* to \* till you reach the point, into the ch 1 of the point work dc + ch 1 + dc, ch 3, rept from \* to \* ending with a dc into the last ch 1 sp

Row 2 - ch 1, t, into each ch 3 sp all the way around work htr + tr + ch 3 and slst to top of the tr + tr + htr, ending with a slst into the last stitch, fo

#### To make tassels - Make 3

- Cut a piece of cardboard 6 " in height
- Cut 6 lengths of yarn, slightly longer than the height of your tassel
- Wrap your yarn around the cardboard 15 times
- · Slip one piece of yarn though the centre and tie tightly at the top
- Slide the tassel off the cardboard and lay flat on top of a piece of yarn that is laying horizontal
- Tie tightly around about 2 cm from the top
- Use a darning needle to feed these lengths though the centre to blend them in
- Use the 1st length tied at the top. to attach to the shawl on all 3 corners
- Use a darning needle to feed these lengths back down though the centre to blend them in
- Trim Neatly

Weave in all ends





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
