





# CY1954 ARGYLE SWEATERS CYGNET MULTI TWEEDS ARAN

## **MEASUREMENTS**

To Fit Bust (3 sizes) 87 - 92 [97 - 102 and 107 -112] cm 34 - 36 [38 - 40 and 42 - 44] ins

Actual Measurement (approx) 104[114 and 125] cm 41 [45 and 49] ins

Full Length 49[53 and 56] cm 19[21 and 22] ins

**MATERIALS** 

Blue Sweater: 3 x 100g balls Cygnet Multi Tweeds Aran shade Navy 1260 (A)

1 x 100g ball Cygnet Aran shade Cream 288 (B)

and an oddment of Cygnet Aran shade Heather 355 (C)

Cream Sweater: 3 x 100g balls Cygnet Multi Tweeds Aran shade Granary 1200(A)

1 x 100g ball Cygnet Multi Tweeds Aran shade Bramble 1230(B)

and an oddment of Cygnet Aran shade Denim 185(C)

A pair of 4 mm and 5 mm knitting needles (US 6 and 8)

Stitch holders



# **TENSION**

18 sts and 24 rows to 4 in [10 cm] measured over stocking stitch on 5 mm needles
IT IS IMPORTANT TO WORK TO THE STATED TENSION IN ORDER TO OBTAIN THE CORRECT MEASUREMENTS
IF YOUR TENSION SQUARE IS TOO SMALL USE A LARGER NEEDLE, IF TOO LARGE USE A THICKER NEEDLE

NOTE: The instructions are written for smallest size. If changes are necessary for larger sizes the instructions will be written thus ( ). When only one set of figures is given this applies to all sizes.



#### **Chart Notes**

One square represents one knitted stitch and the shade will tell you which yarn to use.

Start at the bottom of the chart and work up in rows.

Odd numbered rows are RS rows and are read from right to left.

Even numbered rows are WS rows and are read from left to right.

The diagonal lines can be swiss darned afterwards when the garment is completed.

Use the intarsia method of colourwork which uses separate small balls of yarn for each colour section

#### **FRONT**

Using smaller needles and yarn A, cast on 90[102:110] sts.

**Row 1:** K2, \* P2, K2, rept from \* to end.

**Row 2:** P2, \* K2, P2, rept from \* to end.

Work 10[16:22] more rows in rib, inc 2[0:2] sts evenly across last row. 92[102:112] sts. \*\*

Change to larger needles and beg with a K row work in stst and patt from Chart as follows, using Yarn A for edge sts:

**Row 1:** K1[6:11] [work across row 37 of 45 st patt rept] twice, K1[6:11].

**Row 2:** P1[6:11] [work across row 38 of 45 st patt rept] twice, P1[6:11].

These 2 rows set position of Chart.

Cont working from Chart as set from row 39 to end of Row 72. Work rows 1 - 50[52:54] of Chart as set.

## **Shape Neck**

Keeping chart position correct and working next row of Chart, cont as follows:

**Next row:** Patt 34[37;40], turn and work on these sts only.

Next row: Patt to end.

**Next row:** Patt to last 2 sts, skpo. Rept last 2 rows 5 times more.

28[31:34] sts.

Next row: (WS) Patt to end.

**Shape Shoulder** 

Work in patt to end of Chart, change to yarn A work 1[3:5] rows at same time cast off 5[6:7] sts at beg of next row and 2 foll

RS rows. 13 sts.

**Next row:** (WS) Patt to end.

**Next row: (RS)** cast off 6 sts, patt to end. 7 sts.

Work one row. Cast off.

## **Shape Right Front Neck**

With RS facing, place next 24[28:32] sts onto a holder, rejoin yarn to rem 34[37:40]sts and patt to end.

**Next row:** (WS) Patt to end. **Next row:** K2tog, patt to end. Rept last 2 rows 5 times more.

28[31:34] sts. Patt 2 rows.

#### **Shape Shoulder**

Work in patt to end of Chart, change to yarn A work 2[4:6] rows at same time cast off 5[6:7] sts at beg of next row and 2 foll WS rows. 13 sts.

Next row: patt to end.

**Next row: (WS)** cast off 6 sts, patt to end. 7 sts.

Work one row.
Cast off rem 7 sts.

#### **BACK**

Work as given for Back to \*\*
Change to larger needles and cont
in stst using A throughout until
Back measures same as Front to
shoulders.

# **Shape Shoulders**

Cast off 5[6:7] sts at beg of next 6 rows. 62[66:70] sts
Cast off 6 sts at beg of next 2 rows, then 7 sts at beg of foll 2 rows. Leave rem 36[40:44] sts on a holder.

## **SLEEVES** (Both alike)

Using smaller needles and yarn A, cast on 38[42:46] sts and work 11 [15:17]rows in rib as for Back.

Next row: (inc) rib 3, [m1, rib 2] to last 3 sts, m1, rib 3. 55[61:67] sts. Change to larger needles.

Beg with a K row, work 6 rows in stst.

Next row: (inc) K3, m1, k to last 3 sts, m1, k3. 57[63:69] sts
Work 7 rows in stst.
Rep last 8 rows 9 times more then inc row again. 77[83:89] sts.
Cont without shaping until Sleeve measures 47 cm (18 ½ in) from beg, or length required ending

after a WS row. Cast off.

#### **NECKBAND**

Join right shoulder seam
Using smaller needles and yarn A
and with RS facing, pick up and
K15 sts down left side of front
neck, K24[28,32] sts from Front
neck holder, pick up and K15 sts
up right side of Front neck and
K36[40:44] sts from Back neck
holder. 90[98:106] sts.
Work 7 rows in K2, P2 rib.
Cast off in rib.

#### **FINISHING OFF**

Using Yarn C, Swiss darn diagonal lines using chart as a guide. Join left shoulder and Neckband seams. Placing centre of top of sleeves to shoulder seam, sew in Sleeves. Join side and sleeve seams.
