



## CY1268 HELTER SKELTER CROCHET WRAP AROUND DOG JUMPER

### Materials and Measurements -

Medium - 1 x100g Helter Skelter Big Wheel 5044 and 1 x100g Cygnet Chunky Navy 676

Small - 1 x100g Helter Skelter Tornado 4043 and 1 x100g Cygnet Chunky Teal 428

6mm crochet hook

1 x 25 mm wooden button

### Pattern Notes

Although this is a pattern with a strap and working buttonhole, I advise to sew the strap in place if your dog is very active when out and about, but this is personal choice.

UK Terminology used.

Use this pattern as a guide only.

Measure your dog's neck and chest and use these measurements as a starting point.

Choose which size would suit your dog best, you will be prompted when to adjust the length.

The numbers at the end of each round in brackets, are the amount of stitches you should have at the end of that row.

The CH 1 does not count as a stitch. Always work into the 1st stitch of the row unless otherwise stated.

Approximate measurements of sweater -

Small - length 35 cm, neck 31 cm, chest 40 cm

Medium - length 38 cm, neck 35 cm, chest 45 cm

Gauge - 10 dc and 6 rows = 4" [10 cm]

### Abbreviations –

TC2TOG – treble crochet 2 together

TC – treble crochet

HTC – half treble crochet

INC – Increase, 2 x TC in the same stitch

MC – main colour

CC – contrasting colour

FPTC – front post treble crochet

BPTC - back post treble crochet

NXT - Next

T - turn your work

REM - remaining

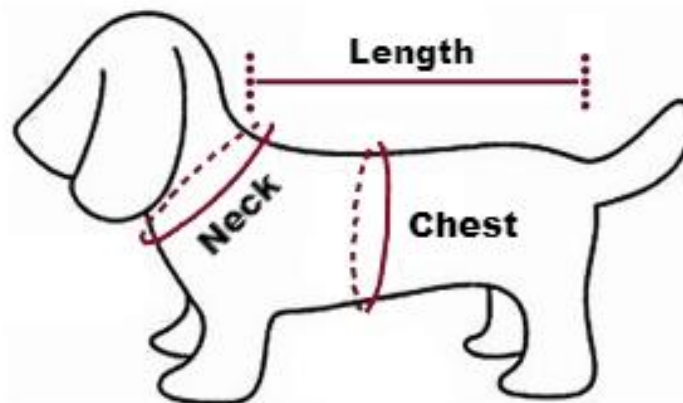
ST - stitch

REP - repeat

SS - slip stitch

SK – skip

CH - chain



### **SMALL**

#### **Neck -**

With CC CH 36 / SS to form a ring

Row 1 - CH 1 / TC around / SS to 1st TC

Rows 2 to 4 - CH 1 / 1 FPTC / 1 BPTC / REP around / SS to 1st FPTC / FO CC and attach MC

Row 5 - CH 1 / TC 35 / INC in last / SS TO 1st TC (37)

Row 6 - CH 1 / TC 36 / INC in last / SS TO 1st TC (38)

Row 7 - CH 1 / TC 37 / INC in last / SS TO 1st TC (39)

Row 8 - CH 1 / TC 38 / INC in last / SS TO 1st TC (40)

Row 9 -CH 1 / INC / TC 38 / INC in last / SS TO 1st TC / FO MC (42)

Try your coat on your dog at this point, and make sure it is sitting just above the shoulder. If you would like a longer fit, Repeat row 9.

Lie flat with seam facing you and attach MC, 8 stitches to the left.

Row 10 - CH 1 / TC 26

Rows 11 and 12 - CH 1 / T / TC 26

Before you make the strap, try the coat on your dog again.

Keeping in mind the strap will be 3 rows wide and should be placed in the center between the dog's front and hind legs.

If you are needing to add extra length to the body, repeat row 12.

### **Strap -**

Row 13 - CH 1 / T / TC 26 / CH 25

Row 14 - In 2nd CH TC / TC in the NXT 23 CHS / TC in the 26 TC (50)

Row 15 - CH 1 / T / TC 47 / CH 1 / SK 1 / TC in last 2

Row 16 - CH 1 / T / TC in 2 / TC IN CH / TC 47 (50)

Rows 17 to 19 - CH 1 / T / TC 26

Before making the reductions, try your coat on your dog.

It should be sitting midway across the hind legs. If you need to an extra length repeat row 19.

Row 20 - CH 1 / T / TC2TOG / TC 22 / TC2TOG (24)

Row 21 - CH 1 / T / TC2TOG / TC 20 / TC2TOG (22)

Row 22 - CH 1 / T / TC2TOG x 2 / TC 14 / TC2TOG x 2 (18)

Row 23 - CH 1 / T / TC2TOG x 2 / TC 10 / TC2TOG x 2 / FO MC (14)

### **Trim -**

Attach CC into last stitch and work 1 HTC into every ST.

When you reach the corner, place HTC + CH 1 + HTC in the corner stitch to move around.

Continue working in this fashion, evenly working 1 HTC in every stitch on the edges and HTC + CH 1 + HTC in every corner stitch.

SS to the first HTC made / FO CC

Try you coat on your dog one last time and figure out where you want your button to be, depending on if you want a snug or loose fit, place a marker here.

Weave in all end and sew on the button.



## **MEDIUM**

### **Neck -**

With CC CH 40 / SS to form a ring

Row 1 - CH 1 / TC around / SS to 1st TC (40)

Rows 2 to 5- CH 1 / 1 FPTC / 1 BPTC / REP around / SS to 1st FPTC / FO CC and attach MC

Row 6 - CH 1 / TC 39 / INC in last / SS TO 1st TC (41)

Row 7 - CH 1 / TC 40 / INC in last / SS TO 1st TC (42)

Row 8 - CH 1 / TC 41 / INC in last / SS TO 1st TC (43)

Row 9 - CH 1 / TC 42 / INC in last / SS TO 1st TC (44)

Row 10 - CH 1 / INC / TC 42 / INC in last / SS TO 1st TC / FO MC (46)

Row 11 - CH 1 / TC around / SS TO 1st TC (46)

Try your coat on your dog at this point, and make sure it is sitting just above the shoulder. If you would like a longer fit, Repeat row 9.

Lie flat with seam facing you and attach MC, 9 stitches to the left.

Row 12 - CH 1 / TC 28

Rows 13 and 14 - CH 1 / T / TC 28

Before you make the strap, try the coat on your dog again.

Keeping in mind the strap will be 3 rows wide and should be placed in the center between the dog's front and hind legs.

If you are needing to add extra length to the body, repeat row 12

### **Strap -**

Row 15 - CH 1 / T / TC 28 / CH 27

Row 16 - In 2nd CH TC / TC in the NXT 25 CHS / TC in the 28 TC (54)

Row 17 - CH 1 / T / TC 51 / CH 1 / SK 1 / TC in last 2

Row 18 - CH 1 / T / TC in 2 / TC IN CH / TC 51 (54)

Rows 19 to 22 - CH 1 / T / TC 28

Before making the reductions, try your coat on your dog.

It should be sitting midway across the hind legs. If you need to an extra length repeat row 19.

Row 20 - CH 1 / T / TC2TOG / TC 24 / TC2TOG (26)

Row 21 - CH 1 / T / TC2TOG / TC 22 / TC2TOG (24)

Row 22 - CH 1 / T / TC2TOG x 2 / TC 16 / TC2TOG x 2 (20)

Row 23 - CH 1 / T / TC2TOG x 2 / TC 12 / TC2TOG x 2 / FO MC (16)

## Trim -

Attach CC into last stitch and work 1 HTC into every ST.

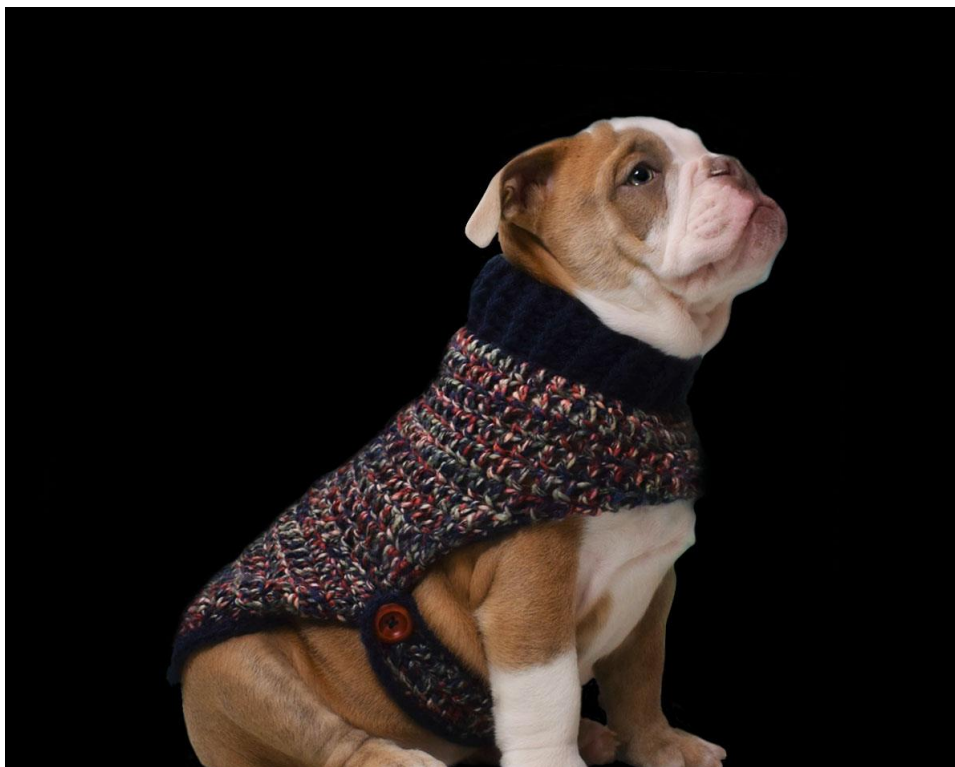
When you reach the corner, place HTC + CH 1 + HTC in the corner stitch to move around

Continue working in this fashion, evenly working 1 HTC in every stitch on the edges and HTC + CH 1 + HTC in every corner stitch.

SS to the first HTC made /  
FO CC

Try you coat on your dog one last time and figure out where you want your button to be, depending on if you want a snug or loose fit, place a marker here.

Weave in all ends and sew on the button.
