



CY1695 Seriously Chunky

Neon Pink Mossy Sweater

Materials

9 (10,11) balls of Seriously Chunky Shade 6534 Neon Pink 12mm circular knitting needles 15mm circular knitting needles Yarn sewing needle 2 Stitch markers

TECHNIQUES:

Long-tail cast on 1x1 rib Double Seed stitch: Row 1-2. [K1, P1] across. Row 3-4. (RS) [P1, K1] across. Repeat Rows 1-4 to work Double Seed stitch.

TENSION:

7 Stitches x 8 rows = 10cm/4" on 15mm needles in Double Seed stitch

NOTES:

Mossy is worked in the round, to avoid seaming where possible. The body is worked seamlessly to the underarms, and worked flat for the fronts and back. The sleeves are worked seamlessly, then seamed at the shoulders to provide extra support. The collar is then picked up and knitted in the round, for a professional finish. Mossy also has oversized sleeves with a slight balloon effect.

FINISHED DIMENSIONS:

This pattern includes instructions for three sizes. When the instructions between each size differ, the instructions are given for the smallest size first, then medium, and the largest size (e.g. small (medium, large)

	Small (bust 32"- 34")	Medium (bust 36"- 38")	Large (bust 40"- 42")
Length measure from top of shoulder to hem	56cm	57cm	58cm
Width measure flat across garment	60cm	65cm	70cm
Armhole measure flat from top of shoulder to underarm	19cm	21cm	23cm

BODY:

- 1. Using 12mm needles, cast on 80 (86, 94) stitches using the long-tail cast on technique. Join in the round, taking care not to twist your stitches.
- 2. Work in 1x1 rib for 5 rows.
- 3. Change to 15mm needles. Decrease to 72 (78, 84) stitches in Double Seed stitch.
- 4. Continue working in Double Seed stitch until your work measures 37cm from the cast on edge. You will now work the back and front sections separately, working back and forth.
- 5. You will first work the back panel Work Double Seed stitch for 38 (42, 44) stitches. Leave the remaining 34 (36, 40 sts) on the circular needle cable to be worked later, or alternatively transfer them to waste yarn or a stitch holder.
- 6. Turn your work, continue working flat in Double Seed stitch for a further 13 (13, 14) rows. Cast off.
- 7. You will now work the front panel Rejoin the yarn and work Double Seed stitch across the remaining 34 (36, 40 sts).
- 8. Turn your work, continue working flat in Double Seed stitch for a further 11 (11, 12) rows.
- 9. Work Double Seed stitch across 12 (12, 13) stitches, cast off 10 (12, 14) stitches, continue working Double Seed stitch across the remaining 12 (12, 13) stitches.
- 10. Work Double Seed stitch for 9 (9, 10) stitches, decrease 2 stitches, work the final stitch. Cast off. Cut the yarn approximately 12"/30cm from the final stitch, and pull on the loop until it pops through. We will use this yarn tail to seam the shoulders.
- 11. Rejoin the yarn to outside edge of the front panel. Work Double Seed stitch for 9 (9, 10) stitches, decrease 2 stitches, work the final stitch. Cast off. Cut the yarn approximately 12"/30cm from the final stitch, and pull on the loop until it pops through. We will use this yarn tail to seam the shoulders.

SLEEVES: make 2

- 1. Using 12mm needles, cast on 16 (16, 18) stitches using the long-tail cast on technique. Join in the round, taking care not to twist your stitches.
- 2. Work in 1x1 rib for 5 rows.
- 3. Change to 15mm needles. Increase to 24 (26, 28) stitches in Double Seed stitch.
- 4. Continue working in Double Seed stitch until your work measures 47 (47.5, 48.5cm) from the cast on edge. Cast off. Cut the yarn approximately 24"/60cm from the final stitch, and pull on the loop until it pops through. We will use this yarn tail to seam the sleeves to the body.

CONSTRUCTION:

- 1. Using your yarn tail attached to the front panel, seam front and back panels at the shoulders, using the horizontal invisible seam technique. Weave in the ends.
- 2. Repeat Step 1 for the other shoulder seam.
- 3. Using 12mm needles, pick up and knit 30 (32, 34) stitches around the neckline (14 (15, 16) along the back, 16 (17, 18) across the front). Work 1x1 rib for 4 rows. Cast off. Weave in the ends.
- 4. Using your yarn tail attached to the sleeve, sew the sleeves into the armhold using the vertical invisible seam technique. Take care not to pull the seam too tightly to case it to pucker. Weave in the ends.
- 5. Repeat Step 4 for the other sleeve.



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
