



Pure Wool Retro Granny Bauble

CY1941

Materials –

4 x Cygnet Pure Wool Superwash DK 50g: one each of White 208, Kingfisher 2837, Tartan Green 2150 and Geranium 2185

Crochet Hook: 3.5mm

2 x 6cm Paper mâché baubles (or fibrefill instead)

Sewing up needle

Pattern notes

UK Terminology used

Measurements - to fit a 6cm bauble

TENSION

Your two halves should fit a 6cm bauble snugly inside.

IT IS IMPORTANT TO WORK TO THE STATED TENSION IN ORDER TO OBTAIN THE REQUIRED MEASUREMENTS

Abbreviations

ch = chain; cm = centimetres; dc = double crochet; tr = treble crochet; slst = slip stitch; inc = treble crochet twice into the next space; blo = back loop only

- **Please note the chains at the start of each round count as a stitch**

Pattern

Front and back (make 2 pieces the same)

Making the two-colour version (make 2)

Using Kingfisher and 3.5mm hook, make a magic ring.

Round 1: Ch3, 11tr into ring. Join with a slst to the top of ch3 and fasten off. (12sts)

Round 2: With White, join yarn in between any two trebles from round 1, ch3, 1tr into the same space. 2tr in the space between each tr from round 1. Join with a slst to the top of the first ch3 and fasten off. (24sts)

Round 3: With Kingfisher, join in yarn in between any cluster of two trebles from round 2, ch3, 2tr into the same space. 3tr in the space between each 2tr cluster from round 2. Join with a slst to the top of the first ch3 and fasten off. (36sts)

Round 4: With White, join yarn in between any cluster of three trebles from round 3, ch3, 2tr into the same space. 3tr in the space between each 3tr cluster from round 3. Join with a slst to the top of the first ch3 and fasten off. (36sts)

Round 5: With Kingfisher, join in yarn into the top of any treble from round 4, ch1. 1dc into each tr and join with a slst to the top of the first ch1 and fasten off. (36sts)

Making the three-colour version (make 2)

Using White and 3.5mm hook, make a magic ring.

Round 1: Ch3, 11tr into ring. Join with a slst to the top of ch3 and fasten off. (12sts)

Round 2: With Tartan Green, join yarn in between any two trebles from round 1, ch3, 1tr into the same space. 2tr in the space between each tr from round 1. Join with a slst to the top of the first ch3 and fasten off. (24sts)

Round 3: With Geranium, join in yarn in between any cluster of two trebles from round 2, ch3, 2tr into the same space. 3tr in the space between each 2tr cluster from round 2. Join with a slst to the top of the first ch3 and fasten off. (36sts)

Round 4: With White, join yarn in between any cluster of three trebles from round 3, ch3, 2tr into the same space. 3tr in the space between each 3tr cluster from round 3. Join with a slst to the top of the first ch3 and fasten off. (36sts)

Round 5: With Tartan Green, join in yarn into the top of any treble from round 4, ch1. 1dc into each tr and join with a slst to the top of the first ch1 and fasten off. (36sts)

Joining the halves to create the baubles

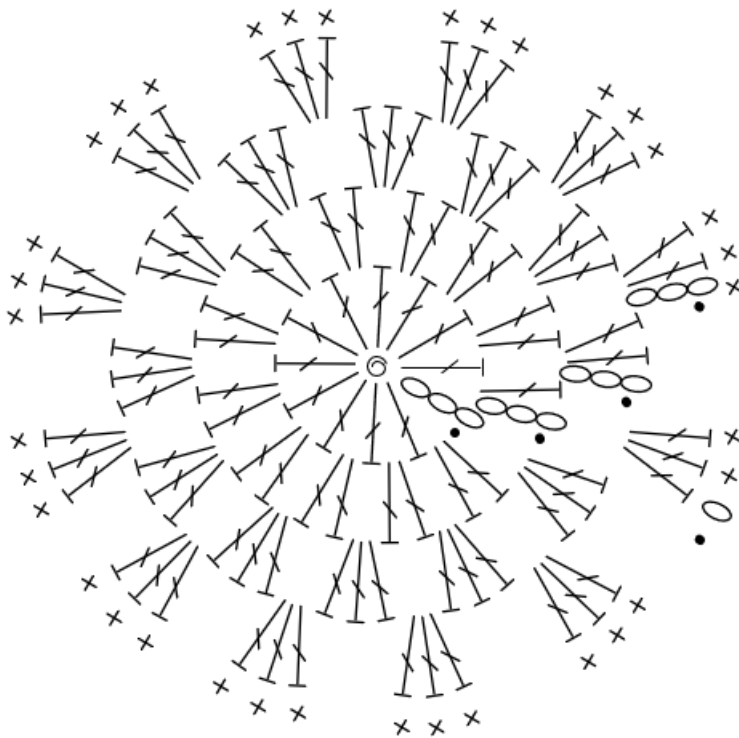
Join a new colour yarn by working a slst into blo of each half of the bauble. Work around the bauble slip stitching into the blo of each stitch until reaching the first slst. Cut a long length of yarn and stitch into the first slst, replicating the 'loop'. Fasten off yarn.

If your bauble does not already have a hanging loop, join in yarn to the slst round and chain 22. Join with a slst to where you initially joined your yarn in and fasten off. Feed ends underneath the crochet to hide them.

Your Bauble is ready to display!
