



CY1334 Cygnet Chunky and Chenille Colourful Wrap around Dog Sweaters For medium size breeds

You will need

5.5 mm and 6 mm crochet hooks

1 x 100g ball Cygnet Chunky featured Honeydew 978, Red 167 & Turquoise 365

1 x 100g ball of Chenille Chunky for the trim featured Gunmetal 4786

2 x 15 mm wooden buttons

Pattern notes -

UK terminology used

Use this pattern as a guide only

Measure your dog's neck and chest and use these measurements as a starting point.

Choose which size would suit your dog best, you will be prompted when to adjust the length.

The numbers at the end of each round in brackets, are the amount of stitches you should have at the end of that row.

The ch 1 does not count as a stitch, always work into the 1st stitch of the row unless otherwise stated.

Work in rounds, do not turn unless otherwise stated.

Approximate measurements of finished sweater -

Small – length 38 cm, neck 29 cm, chest 40 cm

Medium – length 42 cm, neck 32 cm, chest 44 cm

Large - length 48 cm, neck 35 cm, chest 48 cm

Gauge - 10 dc and 6 rows = 4" [10 cm]

Abbreviations –

tc2tog – treble crochet 2 together

tc - treble crochet

dc – double crochet

inc – increase - 2 x tc into the same stitch

ch(s) – chain(s)

sk – skip

slst- slip stitch

rept - repeat

st(s)- stitch(s)

rem - remaining

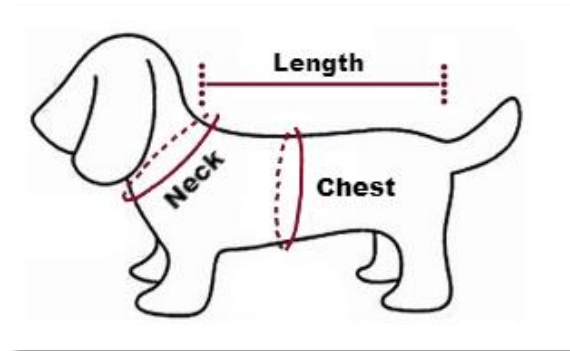
t - turn your work

nxt - next

sp(s) – space(s)

fo – fasten off yarn

blo – work into the back loop only



Small

Neck Ribbing

With your 5.5 mm hook, ch 7

1 - into 2nd ch from hook, dc, dc into every ch across (6)

2 till 32 - ch 1, t, dc into 1st st, dcblo into nxt 4, dc into last st

Line up edges and going through both layers, slst into every st to join.

Turn the right way out.

Body

Change to 6 mm hook

1 - ch 1, dc into every row around (32)

2 - ch 1, tc 31, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (33)

3 - ch 1, tc 32, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (34)

4 - ch 1, tc 33, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (35)

5 - ch 1, tc 34, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (36)

Try your coat on your dog at this point, and make sure it is sitting just above the shoulder. If you would like a longer fit, repeat row 5.

Once you have the correct length, fo.

Lie flat with the seam facing you and reattach your yarn 7 sts to the left

6 - ch 1, tc 24

7 and 8 - ch 1, t, tc 24

Before you make the strap, try the coat on your dog again.

Keeping in mind the strap will be 3 rows wide and should be placed in the centre between the dog's front and hind legs.

If you are needing to add extra length to the body, repeat row 1.

Strap - 9 - ch 1, t, tc 24, ch 23

10 - Into 2nd ch, tc, tc into nxt 22 chs, tc into the 24 tc (46)

11 and 12 - ch 1, tc across all sts (46)

13 to 15 - ch 1, t, tc 24

Before making the reductions, try your coat on your dog.

It should be midway across the hind legs.

If you need extra length repeat row 15

16 - ch 1, t, tc2tog, tc 20, tc2tog (22)

17 - ch 1, t, tc2tog, tc 18, tc2tog (20)

18 - ch 1, t, tc2tog x 2, tc 12, tc2tog x 2, fo (16)

Chenille Trim

With your 6mm hook, attach the Chenille yarn into any st on the side.

Ch1, and place 1 dc into every st on the edge, work 2 dc into the corners to help you move around, slst to 1st dc, fo

Try your coat on your dog one last time and figure out where you want your buttons to be, depending on if you want a snug or loose fit, place markers.

Weave in all ends and sew on buttons.

Medium

Neck Ribbing

With your 5.5 mm hook, ch 9

1 - dc into 2nd ch, dc across (8)

2 to 36 - ch 1, t, dc into 1st, dcbl into nxt 6, dc into last

Line up edges and going through both layers, slst into every st to join.

Turn the right way out.

Body

Change to 6 mm hook

1 - ch 1, work 1 dc into every row around (36)

2 - ch 1, tc 35, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (37)

3 - ch 1, tc 36, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (38)

4 - ch 1, tc 37, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (39)

5 - ch 1, tc 38, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (40)

6 - ch 1, inc, tc 38, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (42)

Try your coat on your dog at this point and make sure it is sitting above the shoulder.

If you would like a longer fit, repeat row 6

Once you have the correct length, fo.

Lie flat with the seam facing you and re attach your yarn 8 sts to the left.

7 - ch 1, tc 26

8 and 9 - ch 1, t, tc 26

Before you make the strap, try the coat on your dog again.

Keeping in mind the strap will be 3 rows wide and should be placed in the centre between the dog's front and hind legs.

If you are needing to add extra length to the body, repeat row 9.

Strap –

10 - ch 1, t, tc 26, ch 25

11 - into 2nd ch from hook tc, tc into nxt 23 chs, tc into the 26 tc (50)

12 and 13 - ch 1, t, tc across

14 and 15 - ch 1, t, tc 26 (26)

Before making the reductions, try the coat on your dog again.

It should be sitting midway across the hind legs.

If you need extra length, repeat row 15.

16 - ch 1, t, tc2tog, tc 22, tc2tog (24)

17 - ch 1, t, tc2tog, tc 20, tc2tog (22)

18 - ch 1, t, tc2tog x 2, tc 14, tc2tog x 2 (18)

19 - ch 1, t, tc2tog x 2, tc 10, tc2tog x 2 (14)

Chenille Trim

With your 6mm hook, attach the chenille yarn into any st on the side.

Ch 1 and place 1 dc into every st on the edge, place 2 dc into every corner to help you move around, slst to 1st dc, fo

Try you coat on your dog one last time and figure out where you want your button to be depending on if you want a snug or loose fit, place markers.

Weave in all ends and sew on buttons

Large

Neck Ribbing

With your 5.5mm hook, ch 11

1 - into 2nd ch from hook dc, dc across

2 to 40 - ch 1, t, dc into 1st, dc into 8, dc into last (10)

Line up edges and going through both layers, slst into every st to join.

Turn the right way out

Change to 6mm hook

1 - ch 1, work 1 dc into every row around (40)

2 - ch 1, tc 39, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (41)

3 - ch 1, tc 40, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (42)

4 - ch 1, tc 41, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (43)

5 - ch 1, tc 42, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (44)

6- ch 1, inc into 1st, tc 42, inc into last, slst to 1st tc (46)

7 - ch 1, tc around, slst to 1st dc (46)

Try your coat on your dog at this point and make sure it is sitting just above the shoulder.

If you would like a longer fit, repeat row 7.

Once you have your correct length, fo.

Lie flat with seam facing you and reattach your yarn 9 sts to the left.

8 - ch 1, t, tc 28

9 and 10 - ch 1, t, tc 28

Before you make the strap, try the coat on your dog again.

Keeping in mind the strap will be 3 rows wide and should be placed in the centre between the dog's front and hind legs.

If you are needing to add extra length, repeat row 9

Strap –

11 - ch 1, t, tc 28, ch 27

12 - in 2nd ch from hook tc, tc into nxt 25 chs, tc into the 28 tc (54)

13 and 14 - ch 1, t, tc 54

15 to 18 - ch 1, t, tc 28

Before making your reductions, try the coat on your dog again.

If should be sitting midway across the hind legs.

If you need to add extra length, repeat row 18.

19 - ch 1, t, tc2tog, tc 24, tc2tog (26)

20 - ch 1, t, tc2tog, tc 22, tc2tog (24)

21 - ch 1, t, tc2tog x 2, tc 16, tc2tog x 2 (20)

21 - ch 1, t, tc2tog x 2 tc 12, tc2tog x 2, fo (16)

Chenille Trim

With your 6mm hook, attach the chenille yarn into any st on the side.

Ch 1 and place 1 dc into every st on the side around, work 2 dc into every corner to help you move around, slst to 1st dc, fo

Try your coat on your dog one last time and figure out where you want your buttons to be, depending if you want a snug or loose fit, place markers.

Weave in all ends and sew on buttons.



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
