



# CY1721 Cygnet baby colour soft dk Toddler shells poncho

## Materials

1 100g ball of Cygnet Pato Everyday DK in 999 White - Yarn A

1 100g ball of Cygnet Coloursoft BabyDK in 555 Peachy O – Yarn B

4 and 4.5mm crochet hooks

2 x 15 mm wooden buttons

#### Pattern notes -

UK terminology used.

The chain 1 does not count as a stitch.

Increase – 2 treble crochet worked into the same stitch or space.

Shell stitch – 5 treble crochet worked into the same stitch or space.

Abbreviations -	inc – increase stitch	t – turn your work
tr – treble crochet	ch(s) – chain(s)	fo – fasten off yarn
htr – half treble crochet	sk – skip	nxt – next
dc – double crochet	st(s) – stitch(s)	bet – between
sh – shell stitch	tur – turning	sp(s) – space(s)

With your 4mm hook and yarn A – chain 53			
	(50)		
Row 1 – htr into 2 <sup>nd</sup> ch from hook, htr into each ch across	(52)		
Row 2 – ch 1, t, * tr into nxt 2, inc into nxt, rept from * till 1 st left, tr into last	(69)		
Row 3 – ch 1, t, tr across			
Row 4 – ch 1, t, * tr into nxt 2, inc into nxt, rept from * across	(92)		
Row 5 – ch 1, t, tr across			
Row 6 – ch 1, t, * tr into nxt 2, inc into nxt, rept from * across			
Rows 7 and 8 – ch 1, t, tr across			
Fo yarn A			
Body section -			
Change to 4.5mm hook and yarn B			
Row 9 – ch 1, 3 tr into 1 <sup>st</sup> st, * sk 2, dc into nxt, sk 2, sh into nxt * rept from * to * 18 more times, sk 2,	dc		
into nxt, sk 3, 3 tr into last (19 shells and 2 half shells)			
Row 10 – ch 1, t, dc into 1 <sup>st</sup> , * sh into dc, sk 2 tr, dc into nxt, sk 2 tr, sh into dc, rept from * across ending			
with dc into the last st			
Row 11 – ch 1, t, 3 tr into 1 <sup>st</sup> st, * sk 2 tr, dc into nxt, sk 2 tr, sh into dc, 3 tr into last st			
Rept rows 10 and 11 until you have worked a total of 19 shell rows or reached your desired length.			
Fo yarn B			
Change to 4mm hook and yarn A			
Turn the poncho upside down and attach yarn into the 1 <sup>st</sup> stitch of the row			
Collar –			
Row 1 – ch 1, work 1 tr into each st on row 1	(52)		
Rows 2 and 3 – ch 1, t, tr across, fo			
Trim -			
Attach yarn into bottom left corner			
Row 1 – ch 1, work dc evenly around, working a dc + ch 1 + dc into the corner stitches on the collar,			
continue till you reach the bottom right side.			

#### Button band -

Row 2 – ch 1, t, dc into each dc st till you reach the yoke (white) section, ch 3, sk 1, dc 5, ch 3, sk 1, dc all the way around, adding a dc + ch 1 + dc into each of the ch 1 cor sps

Fasten off and weave in all ends.


## Chain tie –

With your 4mm hook and yarn A, ch 120.

## Tassels – Make 2

- Cut a piece of cardboard 3 " in height
- Cut 4 lengths of yarn, slightly longer than the height of your tassel
- Wrap your yarn around the cardboard 20 times
- Slip one piece of yarn though the centre and tie tightly at the top
- Slide the tassel off the cardboard and lay flat on top of a piece of yarn that is laying horizontal
- Tie tightly around about 1 cm from the top
- Use a darning needle to feed these lengths though the centre to blend them in
- Use the 1st length tied at the top. to attach onto the ends of the chain
- Use a darning needle to feed these lengths back down though the centre to blend them in
- Trim Neatly

Weave in all ends
